Internships

- 3 Ways of Identifying an Intern:
 1. You get “tapped” or by national facilitator
 2. Self-selection/self-nomination
 3. Tapped/Pushed by entity to build “in house” capacity
- Intern is paired with/pairs with a mentor/national facilitator
 - Qualifications for mentor NF?
 - Must be trained CFG coach
 - Must have CFG coaching experience
 - Interns and mentoring NF are identified at national center by center of activity with self-assessment reflection in writing
 - Gateway #1 Screening and readiness
- Internship
 - Experiences in local context/with a center
 - new coach training
 - observe
 - co-facilitate
 - developmental experiences in facilitation
 - Coach own CFG with feedback loop
 - Experiences in “broader context”
 - Work with another centers training
 - Attend National Facilitator Meeting
 - Conferencing with mentor at every point

Documenting Our Work: Making Our Practice Public

- Student data- Evidence: impact on student learning
- Evidence: Passion, strength, content, breadth & depth of experience (e.g. – audiences, contexts, locations, geography, grade levels, formats)
- Evidence: Growth, reflection, artifacts, patterns documenting thinking process
- Evidence: Where you are taking risks in your work
- We will create a protocol that supports the examination of our work. (Look at layers like peel the onion.)
- 3-4 People at facilitators meeting
- Connect to centers - - These conversations in centers – individuals and as centers (doc. Center work)
